Definitions: bullying and violence

Definitions According to the Law

• Deliberate or not (it is the impact of the act that counts) • Feeling of distress of the victim Bullying • Direct or indirect (including cyberspace) • A repeated comment, act or gesture nature • Power imbalance Intentional • Expressed in many ways (verbal, written, physical, psychological Violence or sexual) Not necessarily repeated Hurts or oppresses a victim • Confrontation which usually implicates Conflict individuals of equal power Confrontation or disagreement between two people

"Any behaviour, spoken word, act or gesture, whether deliberate or not and of a repetitive character, expressed directly or indirectly, including in cyberspace, in a context characterized by a disparity in the balance of power between the concerned persons, having the effect of engendering feelings of distress, injury, hurt, oppression or of being ostracized; "Art. 13, LIP 2012

Any intentional demonstration of verbal, written, physical, psychological or sexual force which causes distress and injures, hurts or oppresses a person by attacking their psychological or physical integrity or well-being, or their rights or property.

As soon as bullying or violence has an impact on what happens at school and concerns individuals of the school, no matter the place or time these acts were committed, the school must deal with this impact.
